Objective

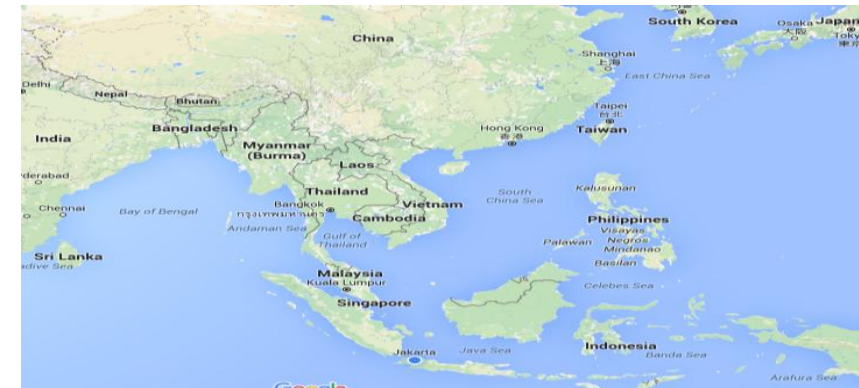
1. To enhance participants' knowledge of global health issues, particularly infectious and zoonotic diseases.

STRENGTH

- 1.The only international leadership training program which nurtured the participants to tackle global health problems by implementing multidisciplinary approach.
- 2.It equipped the participants with knowledge which was implemented into real-life setting through field work and site visit.

WEAKNESS

- 1.The implementation of multidisciplinary approach was conducted in a basic stage through the activities
- 2.The GHTL in other countries had not achieved other funding resource yet,

- 1.Competent leader in such across profession partnership is needed to support GHSA implementation
- 2.Three states universities in Indonesia have successfully implemented interprofessional education in its curriculum, which is in line with GHTL goals
